#### **Facilities:**



Railway station: Penrith 17 miles.

**Bus stop:** 500m from site entrance on routes to Penrith, Carlisle and Lancaster.

Worth noting: No awnings, tents or wind breaks permitted on Derwentwater, The Oval. Minimum booking from 20 July to 1 September and English Bank Holiday is five nights (except standard pitches), all other times three nights. There are no dishwashing facilities at The Oval and it is some distance from the laundry. No electric hook-ups on Walker Park and it is some distance from the laundry. All grass pitches are in a separate area to the hardstanding pitches and there are no dishwashing facilities. The site is not accessible to Derwentwater lake, so no canoes or kayaks can be launched from here. ### A perfect location in the North Lakes

Our Derwentwater Site has two distinct areas of touring pitches - The Oval and Walker Park - since Welcome Way is now dedicated to caravan holiday homes. The site makes a perfect base for a walking, cycling or relaxing holiday in the Lake District.

The site is ideal for water sport lovers, and you can hire canoes, kayaks, sailing dinghies, windsurfers and rowing boats at Derwentwater Marina, where you can also take part in taster or refresher courses in sailing, windsurfing, canoeing, kayaking, ghyll scrambling, rock climbing and raft-building.

The town of Keswick is a two-minute walk from the site, and offers a variety of shops, restaurants and pubs, as well as the Cumberland Pencil Museum, Keswick Mining Museum and the Puzzling Place, an exhibition based on optical illusions. You can also take the Keswick Launch around Derwentwater, with discounted tickets available from site reception.

Other nearby attractions include Castlerigg Stone Circle, Honister Slate Mine - which features an exciting Via Ferrata - and GoApe! at Whinlatter Forest.
