"Even within our own DA we have children whose lives were saved by heart surgery. It's just over four years since one little boy's life-saving operation at Leeds heart unit. The charity helped provide accommodation over Christmas for his mum and dad on the hospital site. CHSF funds games on the ward and supports families facing incredibly difficult times. Evan is still receiving treatment but he's a regular at our meets and brings a smile to all our members."


